A: 'Let us prey.'

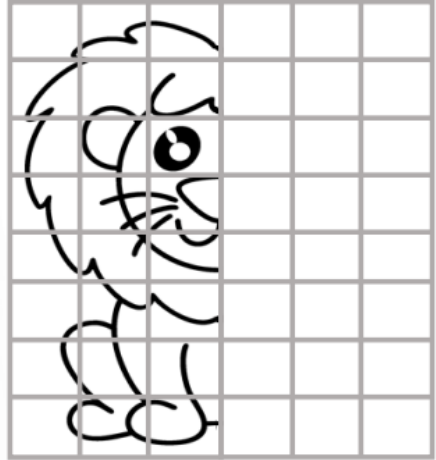
